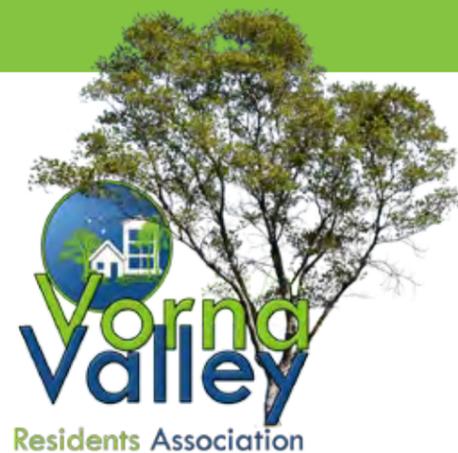



City Power


A few areas in Vorna Valley were left without power a few times, but no load shedding again.

The VVRA fought for years to get financing from council to rehabilitate our Wetland as the dongas were getting bigger and bigger each year. All Sanral's storm water ends up in our Vlei and more and more high density development in Vorna Valley with townhouses etc, contributed to this erosion. 

Recycling

A reminder that recycling is compulsory. Phambili Services collect recycling in Vorna Valley on behalf of Pikitup, every Wednesday.

If you are not yet recycling with Phambili, please contact marianne@phambiliservices.co.za via email or via whatsapp on 082 460 8662 so that we can make the necessary arrangements.


Phambili Services supply blue bags and collect weekly.

All recycling material goes into one bag. (Paper, Cardboard, Magazines & Newspapers, Plastics, Glass, Bottles, Milk and Juice Cartons, Cans, Jars.

Phambili Services now also place informal reclaimers into complexes to do the recycling on their behalf. Phambili then buys back all the recycling they collect, taking them to the depot to weigh and pay.

This will hopefully take many of the informal reclaimers off the streets and afford them a monthly income.



Invasive Plants, Trees, Birds

Tithonia rotundifolia (Red sunflower)



Red sunflower is a large, robust, annual plant that grows up to 3 m. Its leaves are opposite, each with three broad, round-toothed lobes, and it produces reddish-orange flowers that are borne singly on long stems. Mexican sunflower is a large, evergreen, perennial shrub that grows up to 5 m tall, and has deeply five-lobed, opposite leaves and orange-yellow flowers on erect, hollow, woody stems. In South Africa, red sunflower flowers from late summer throughout autumn while Mexican sunflower flowers throughout autumn and winter. Red sunflower produces fewer, larger and heavier seeds, ensuring vigorous seedling growth and longer survival in a nutrient-poor environment. In contrast, Mexican sunflower produces numerous, smaller and lighter seeds which enable wide dispersal and rapid spread in colonized areas. However, segments of Mexican sunflower that are buried horizontally in the soil also often



sprout. Both Tithonia species are aggressive colonizers of disturbed, sun-exposed ecosystems with a high water table, including plantations, abandoned sites, and along railways and roads. Tithonia rotundifolia is particularly invasive in the inland provinces of Gauteng, Limpopo, Mpumalanga and the North West while Tithonia diversifolia is invasive in the Lowveld regions of Mpumalanga, Limpopo and along the coastal regions of KwaZulu-Natal province. The escalating invasion by the two weeds sunflowers is increasingly threatening the biodiversity and ecological integrity of natural systems as well as agricultural and forestry systems in South Africa.

Myocastor coypus (Coypu, Cane Rat)



Myocastor coypus (coypu) is a large semi-aquatic rodent which originated from South America. However, due to escapes and releases from fur farms there are now large feral populations in North America, Europe and Asia. Their burrows penetrate and damage river banks, dykes and irrigation facilities. M. coypus' feeding methods lead to the destruction of large areas of reed swamp. Habitat loss caused by coypus impacts plant, insect, bird and fish species. This species has been nominated as one of the "100 of the World's Worst" invaders by IUCN. An alert for this species in Ireland was the first Species Alert issued by a European Union Member State under the EU Regulation on Invasive Alien Species (1143/2014).

Myocastor coypus (coypu) is a large rodent (5-9kg; 40-60cm body; 30-45cm tail), superficially rat-like, pelage brown and yellow-brown in colour with a cylindrical tail. It has webbed hindfeet, with a footprint up to 15cm long, imprints of the web is often visible; incisors are prominent and bright orange-yellow (unlike rats which are yellow-brown), with white marks on muzzle (Woods et al. 1992, Carter and Leonard 2002). Faeces cylindrical, up to 70mm long, with fine longitudinal striations (LeBlanc, 1994).

Acacia mearnsii (black wattle)



A. mearnsii is a vigorous, nitrogen fixing species that has precocious and prolific seed production, with a high density and accumulation of long-lived seeds in the soil, and a variety of potential dispersal mechanisms including water, mammals and possibly birds. It causes a number of mainly environmental problems and is hard to control because of its ability to form root suckers. A. mearnsii is a highly invasive species, and listed as one of the World's 100 Worst Invaders



(ISSG, 2007). It has been listed as a category 2 invader in South Africa, a noxious environmental weed in the Global Compendium of Weeds, and a noxious weed in USA (Randall, 2012). It is also known to be invasive in California, USA, Burundi, Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, Rwanda, Tanzania, Uganda, Zimbabwe, Jamaica, Brazil, New Zealand and Réunion, has shown a tendency to invade and cause concerns in other countries, e.g. in India, and is widely naturalized elsewhere where it may become invasive in the future.

Category 1a (PROHIBITED) : Listed Invasive Species

A person in control of a Category 1a Listed Invasive Species must comply with the provisions of section 73(2) of the Act; immediately take steps to combat or eradicate listed invasive species in compliance with sections 75(1), (2) and (3) of the Act; and allow an authorised official from the Department to enter onto land to monitor, assist with or implement the combatting or eradication of the listed invasive species.

Category 1b (PROHIBITED / Exempted if in Possession or Under control) : Listed Invasive Species

A person in control of a Category 1 b Listed Invasive Species must control the listed invasive species in compliance with sections 75(1), (2) and (3) of the Act. A person contemplated in sub-regulation (2) must allow an authorised official from the Department to enter onto the land to monitor, assist with or implement the control of the listed invasive species, or compliance with the Invasive Species Management Programme contemplated in section 75(4) of the Act.

Category 2 (PERMIT REQUIRED): Listed Invasive Species

Category 2 Listed Invasive Species are those species listed by notice in terms of section 70(1)(a) of the Act as species which require a permit to carry out a restricted activity within an area specified in the Notice or an area specified in the permit, as the case may be. A landowner on whose land a Category 2 Listed Invasive Species occurs or person in possession of a permit, must ensure that the specimens of the species do not spread outside of the land or the area specified in the Notice or permit. Unless otherwise specified in the Notice, any species listed as a Category 2 Listed Invasive Species that occurs outside the specified area contemplated in sub-regulation (1), must, for purposes of these regulations, be considered to be a Category 1 b Listed Invasive Species and must be managed according to Regulation 3. Notwithstanding the specific exemptions relating to existing plantations in respect of Listed Invasive Plant Species published in Government Gazette No. 37886, Notice 599 of 1 August 2014 (as amended), any person or organ of state must ensure that the specimens of such Listed Invasive Plant Species do not spread outside of the land over which they have control.

Category 3 (PROHIBITED): Listed Invasive Species

Category 3 Listed Invasive Species are species that are listed by notice in terms of section 70(1)(a) of the Act, as species which are subject to exemptions in terms of section 71(3) and prohibitions in terms of section 71A of the Act, as specified in the Notice. Any plant species identified as a Category 3 Listed Invasive Species that occurs in riparian areas, must, for the purposes of these regulations, be considered to be a Category 1b Listed Invasive Species and must be managed according to regulation 3.
